£2bn entertainment resort planned for Kent coast

A consortium which includes US-based entertainment giant Paramount Pictures has unveiled plans to create a £2bn visitor attraction on the North Kent coast.

Plans for the 872-acre development site, on the Swanscombe Peninsula, include a Paramount-branded entertainment resort and leisure district as part of what is being billed as "Europe's leading entertainment destination". The entertainment district will feature Europe's largest indoor water park, theatres, live music venues, attractions, cinemas, restaurants, event space and hotels.

Development vehicle London Resort Company Holdings (LRCH) has signed an agreement with Paramount Licensing, the licensing division for Paramount Pictures, to give exclusive UK licensing for the theme

park at the heart of the site. The agreement does not include investment from Paramount Licensing in the project.

In a statement, LRCH said it was also in negotiations with a range of major British brands to sign licensing agreements. The LRCH group of firms includes development and investment company Development Securities, the principal landowner Lafarge and super-scale construction company Brookfield Multiplex. The team is also supported by a host of consultants and operators which will help deliver the scheme.

Tony Sefton, project leader for LRCH, said: "Our vision is to create a world-class entertainment destination, the first of its kind in the UK.

"We're at the start of a long journey, but have been encouraged by the support and

buy-in we have had to date. Over the next 12-18 months we will be progressing the planning application, while embarking on a wide-reaching programme of community consultation and securing further commercial agreements." Read more: http://lei.srae.doi.nl

FA launches £100m football centre

The Football Association (FA) has officially launched its new £100m National Football Centre in Burton upon Trent. Staffordshire.

Named St. George's Park, the facility held its first full England national team training session on 9 October, which was attended by the Duke and Duchess of Cambridge and FA chair David Bernstein.

All 24 representative England squads will make use of the 330-acre complex while the League Managers Association is to be headquartered at the site. It will also

provide a base for training referees, administrators and to provide career pathways into the game.

Facilities include a full-sized, indoor 3G football pitch equipped with a viewing gallery for up to 200 people, a 60m x 40m multipurpose indoor sports hall, 11 full-size outdoor pitches and one elite DESSO training pitch which is an exact replica of the pitch at Wembley - the FA's home ground.

There is also a 25,000sq ft, bespoke sports medicine, rehabilitation and performance centre operated by Perform, part of Spire Healthcare. Accommodation at the centre is provided by a 142-room Hilton hotel and an 86-room Hampton by Hilton hotel.

Culture secretary Maria Miller, who also attended the opening, said: "The opening of St George's Park is a landmark moment for football in this country, which will help strengthen our national game at all levels. This summer has shown the importance that sport has at the heart of the British nation.

"It is through projects and investments such as St George's Park that the next generation of coaches can be identified and nurtured, helping to develop the England stars of the future. Good coaching is vital for a sport to grow and I am very pleased that government and the National Lottery have been able to invest £6m to help open up these fantastic facilities." Funding boost for the UK's deaf athletes

Talented deaf athletes will now have more chance of achieving their potential and winning medals at next year's Deaflympics, thanks to a £125,000 grant to UK Deaf Sport, from Sport England.

The investment will fund work to help individual sports fully integrate deaf and hearing-impaired athletes within their development programmes. It will also enable the recruitment of a co-ordinator and performance manager to lead preparations

for the 2013 Deaflympics in Sofia, Bulgaria.

Phillip Gerrard, chair of UK Deaf Sport, says this is a timely boost: "The funding will also support our long-term aim of talent development in Deaf sport, which will see us working with national sports bodies to establish and



embed deaf performance pathways." Team GB's impressive medal haul at the Paralympics has heightened the profile of disability sport and the government has said it is committed to supporting disabled athletes. Details: http://lei.sr?a=q5goE

Glasgow's Emirates Arena opens

More than 100,000 visitors attended the opening weekend of Glasgow's new Emirates Arena.

The sports arena, which opened its doors on 5 October, will play host to the Glasgow 2014 Commonwealth Games. The 10.5-hectare arena is located beside the Commonwealth Games Athletes' Village and the Celtic Park.

It includes an indoor sports arena, three sports halls with 12 badminton courts, four outdoor five-a-side foot-

ball pitches, an outdoor 1km cycle circuit, a Glasgow Club health and fitness centre and a day spa open to the public.

The venue also includes the Sir Chris Hoy Velodrome - named in honour of the six time Olympic Gold medallist - and designed by architect Ralf Schuermann.

The Emirates Arena, which was named under a £5m sponsorship deal with Emirates airline, will host the badminton and track cycling events during the Commonwealth Games. Glasgow City Council and SportScotland funded the £113m project. Details: http://lei.sr?a=Woy1W

New use proposed for greyhound stadium

Wimbledon Greyhound Stadium could become a 10 to 15,000-seat football stadium in a proposal put forward by the Greyhound Racing Authority (GRA).

As well as a football stadium, the proposal includes 450-500 homes and a substantial retail store. It also includes community benefits such as coaching courses to promote sport to young people across London. Merton Council cabinet member for environmental sustainability and regeneration, Councillor Andrew Judge, says this is a positive move which could bring AFC Wimbledon back home to Merton.

The GRA will consult with partners over the coming months to flesh out the plans.

Bisham Abbey plans to go before councillors

World-leading sports facilities at Bisham Abbey, where more than 30 Team GB medalists trained for London 2012 are set to get even better if Sport England's improvement plans are approved by local councillors.

Plans include bringing the outdated accommodation block into the 21st century with 50 new rooms and replacing an existing grass pitch with an artificial grass pitch that will be help meet the growing demand for year-round sport.

Scotland's first basketball school to launch

Scotland's first ever School of Basketball will be launched at the Ardrossan Academy in North Avrshire.

The centre will form a key part of Basketball Scotland's plans to develop the sport and increase participation numbers.

Kevin Pringle, CEO of Basketball Scotland, said: "This is a pilot project which we expect to provide us with the evidence which will allow us to develop partnerships to deliver schools of basketball throughout Scotland over the coming years."

DC Leisure secures £11m Sandwell contract

Plans for an £11m leisure centre and swimming pool in West Bromwich are underway following the signing of a contract between Sandwell Council and DC Leisure.

DC Leisure will design, build, manage and maintain the town centre complex, due to open in summer 2014.

The leisure centre will have a 25m pool and a separate learner pool, a sauna and steamroom, a four-court sports hall, a 100-station fitness suite. two dance studios, an indoor children's adventure play cen-

tre and a cafe. A planning application has been submitted and a decision is expected later this year, with work expected to start early next year. The planned site for the leisure complex is on the corner of Moor and Barton Street.

Gym revamp increases memberships by 80 per cent

A £3m expansion and refurbishment of Kingswood Leisure Centre in Gloucestershire has resulted in a 150 per cent increase in the number of visitors since it opened in May.

Exercise project reduces falls in elderly

Taking part in regular exercise has reduced falls among elderly people by as much as 17 per cent, according to the latest findings from the Liverpool Community Health NHS Trust.

The trust unveiled its latest findings last week, which have been the result of a year-long research study undertaken with Liverpool John Moores University, on the Trust's

award-winning Liveability service, which works to promote the independence and health of old people through exercise.

If current trends continue, by 2024 half of Liverpool's population will be aged 50 or over, which shows the importance of finding an effective way of helping older people improve their health, fitness, quality of life and reduce the risk of falls.



Exercise among the older population could decrease falls by 17 per cent

The study measured the impact of participation in two hours per week of instructor-led gym-type activities on the physical fitness, strength, flexibility, balance and aerobic endurance of participants over a 12 week period.

Hospitality - one of the UK's growth sectors



UFI IBRAHIM is chief executive officer of British Hospitality Association

he recent Channel 4 production Hotel GB may not have been to everyone's taste and certainly seemed to be more interested in its celebrity guests than providing any real illustration of a career in the hotel industry. It did, however, highlight that the hospitality industry can offer good jobs to the young unemployed - no matter how unskilled - as long as the will to work is there.

The fact that all the youngsters (some not so young) were offered a job at the end of the week by a variety of employers shows that even after only a week's experience, their potential shone through. With the excellent TV programme last year on food service skills, which showed how demanding the job of being a waiter is - as well as the numerous chef programmes - the hospitality industry is beginning to get across the message that the opportunities are there for young people.

In fact, as we've repeatedly told government, hospitality is one of the very few industries in the UK creating jobs, apprenticeships, work placements and career opportunities. It's an industry where, like the youngsters in Hotel GB, you can start at the bottom and, with talent, reach the very top. BHA's own research shows that hospitality is set to generate 236,000 jobs between 2010 and 2015. BHA is certainly playing its part.

In July, with Springboard UK, we organised The Big Conversation - an initiative of the Talent and Skills Leadership Group of Business in the Community (BiTC). The event was designed to boost dialogue between employers and youngsters, helping to find jobs and apprenticeships for the young unemployed. At the event key hospitality employers pledged to reduce unemployment by offering structured work placements, apprenticeships and job opportunities during the next three years. The BHA is now working with Springboard and BiTC to roll out more Big Conversations, both regionally and sectorally.

The industry has the potential to grow the economy by creating jobs at all levels, male and female, full-time and part-time. That is the message we must get across.

University opens natural history collection

Science Museum invests in research

The Science Museum has launched a new Research and Public History Department to coordinate the museum's academic research activities.

The department will be tasked with running the museum's research projects: liaise with university departments and other museums; co-supervise students; support research fellows and associates; publish papers and books; and organise public events, conferences and workshops.

Dr. Tim Boon, head of research and public history at the Science Museum, said:

"In research terms, the Science Museum's collections are almost pure potential, so little in-depth research has ever been undertaken. A museum that does not prioritise research cannot understand the stories its

Milestone for Doncaster's new £20m arts venue

A topping out ceremony has been held for a new £20m performance venue in Doncaster. When complete, the centre will house a wide range of spaces and facilities which include a 620-seat theatre kitted out to accommodate touring shows and a 200seat or 400 standing flexible space for live music and smaller productions.

There will also be modern dance and drama studios; various educational and rehearsal spaces that will double up as meeting and conference rooms; a light and spacious foyer area and a café bar with views out onto a public square.

The venue, designed by specialist theatre architects, Arts Team RHWL, is set to become a regional hub for arts and culture in South Yorkshire and beyond.

VINCI Construction UK is now halfway through a two-year construction contract which started in September 2011

The venue is scheduled to be completed in early 2013 and forms an important part of the new £300m Civic and Cultural Quarter (CCQ) planned for Doncaster. The CCQ project is supported financially by the European Union, as part of the European Regional Development Fund's support for the region's economic development through the Yorkshire and Humber ERDF Programme.

Portrait Gallery acquires Thomas Hollis bust

The National Portrait Gallery has acquired the last portrait of the eighteenth-century British thinker Thomas Hollis - one of the architects of American independence - to remain in Britain.

The gallery acquired the portrait, for the nation, following a loan period from a private collection, for £293,157 having received £100,000 towards its purchase from the National Heritage Memorial Fund (NHMF) and £57,000 from the Art Fund. Details: http://lei.sr?a=k7B1K

£20m funding pot for facilities

Arts and culture organisations have been urged to apply for grants of between £100,000 and £499,999 to improve their existing facilities. The funding has been made available as part of Arts Council England's (ACE) £234.6m capital investment fund. In total, £20m of National Lottery money has been budgeted for small capital grants under the scheme, to address the needs of organisations whose plans to improve their existing buildings and equipment do not involve large-scale work.

There will be two funding rounds, with £12m budgeted for 2012-13 and a further £8m available in 2013-14. The new grants are an expansion of ACE's current programme which offers organisations the opportunity to apply for larger grants of £500,000 or more.

Alan Davey, chief executive, Arts Council England, said: "The Arts Council understands that like any trade, artists and performers need the right tools and facilities to effectively deliver and develop their craft and audiences need places where they can properly interact with the art or performance.

Arts Council launches employment scheme

Arts Council England (ACE) has launched a Creative employment programme to help young unemployed people find paid entry-level work in the cultural sector.

The programme is designed to support up to 6,500 new apprenticeships, pre-apprenticeships and paid internships across the sector and will target unemployed people aged between 16 and 24.

ACE has opened a commissioned grant for applications to find a national provider who will deliver the programme. The successful applicant will receive up to

£15m to deliver the scheme and help subsidise new opportunities which will directly benefit unemployed young people until March 2015.

employment programme is a fantastic and vital development for young people interested in working in arts and culture.

"If young people cannot gain entry into the sector workforce we risk losing a generation of talent, which would potentially have an adverse impact on the art that is produced, distributed and attended by the wider population."

Stanley completes final chapter

Youth tourism 'neglected'

Governments and businesses in the travel industry need to spend more on developing youth travel to benefit from its potential according to the World Youth Student & Education Travel Confederation and World Tourism Organisation

The recommendation is part of a special declaration by more than 700 delegates at the World Youth & Student Travel Conference in San Diego, USA, this month, attended by youth travel professionals and government officials. The aim

of the declaration is to provide tourism groups with a platform to lobby governments to fund and help boost youth travel and tourism.

Global tourism to reach 1 billion landmark

UK during the month of August, so exclude visitors who did not leave the country until after the end of the month.

Westfield Brierley Hill mixed-use development

Visitor attraction planned for Brierley Hill

Plans for a major new leisure destination featuring one of Europe's highest indoor ropes courses have been unveiled at Westfield Merry Hill in Brierly Hill, West Midlands. The urban-themed Ouest attraction, which will start a phased opening in November, is part of a £1m investment by Paragon Entertainment and features five new attractions including aerial rope courses, and a themed indoor adventure golf course. Occupying a total area in excess of 20,000sq ft, Quest will include a café as well as an outdoor area which will host a changing programme of family-based leisure activities.

ARB apologises for Piano/Libeskind letter

The government-appointed architecture watchdog ARB (Architects Registration Board) has apologised for suggesting that Renzo Piano and Daniel Libeskind should not be described as architects in the UK press. In early October, ARB sent a letter to Building Design magazine saying that neither Piano nor Libeskind were registered with ARB - therefore being undeserving of the title

Piano is a former Pritzker Prize winner and is famous for having designed the Centre Georges Pompidou in Paris, France as well as Europe's tallest building, The Shard, in London.

In a statement on 9 October, ARB's registrar Alison Carr said: "ARB has to investigate queries regarding individuals who use the title 'architect' in business or practice when they are not registered with ARB. In some cases, the public may genuinely be misled by the use of the term, while in others this is highly unlikely to happen. I believe that the Building Design case falls into the latter category.

"We should have been more cautious so that we get the right message across at the right time, and for that I apologise." Details: http://lei.sr?a=7p4Z8

Castleford Tigers stall on stadium plans

Rugby club Castleford Tigers may be forced to shelve plans for a new stadium and look at redeveloping its current ground.

Last year Castleford signed a deal to sell its ground to a supermarket, which would fund the development of a 13,300 capacity stadium at out of town entertainment and retail centre, Glasshoughton.

However, at a meeting with fans, Castleford chief executive Steve Ferres described the team's financial situation as "precarious".

"The current business model is not working," he said. "We are falling short of Super League's model club and we therefore need to look at ways to work smarter and generate new revenue streams."

A new membership scheme will be part of the 2013 season ticket and 5,000 seasonticket holders are being targeted to ensure the club's survival. As RFL regulations on stadium requirements are now being relaxed, the club may be able to redevelop its current site.

The future of the Learning Legacy website, which was launched by the Olympic Delivery Authority (ODA) to pass on valuable knowledge in construction projects, has been assured.

While the ODA and its operations will be wound up later this year, the website will be taken over and managed by the Major Projects Authority, a partnership between the Cabinet Office and HM Treasury.

"The Learning Legacy initiative was created to ensure the lessons of delivering

one of Europe's largest construction projects were preserved for future generations," said Simon Wright, ODA director of venues and infrastructure.

The site comprises more than 300 papers put together by the ODA and its supply chain



of companies and is the first time a construction project in the UK had sought to capture knowledge on this scale.


