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£12.2m pool opens in Birmingham

Birmingham City Council (BCC) and DC Leisure have launched the new £12.2m Harborne Pool and Fitness Centre, which has been developed on the site of the city's former Harborne Baths.

The facility is the first new public swimming pool built in Birmingham for more than 20 years. Wates Construction delivered the new venue and architects Saunders Boston were behind the design.

Harborne Pool and Fitness Centre boasts a 25m, six-lane swimming pool and a learner pool – in addition to a 70-station adult fitness suite that has been equipped by Pulse, PowerPlate and Trixter.

Facilities also include a large dance and aerobics studio and a smaller gym for young people aged between eight- and 16-years old. An official opening is planned for 28 January.

DC Leisure was appointed by the local authority to operate the venue in December as part of a 10-year management contract, which includes the option of a five-year extension.

February unveiling for Fletcher's Cottage spa

A 750sq m (8,000sq ft) day spa is to open in February at the Archerfield Links championship golf course near Edinburgh.

Facilities at the spa, which were designed and supplied by Nola 7, include a marine salt steam room, a herbal aroma sauna and contrast adventure showers.

The spa also boasts a total of seven treatment rooms – including a double treatment room and a salt brick inhalation room – as well as a large relaxation lounge with a wood burning oven and a secret walled garden with two seaweed bathing houses.

NGB opposes Handball Arena name change

British Handball has announced the launch of a campaign to retain the name of London's Olympic Handball Arena, following a decision to rebrand it as The Copper Box.

The 7,000-seat arena has been given the new name to reflect the materials used in its creation, but the national governing body said it could hinder the sport's 'continued growth'.

Mace submits Derby arena plans

Plans for the development of a new multi-sports arena adiacent to Pride Park Stadium in Derby have been submitted by Derby City Council's (DCC) project manager, Mace.

FaulknerBrowns Architects have designed the 14,500sq m (156,077sq ft) complex, which features a 250m indoor cycling track and a 1.5km (0.9-mile) outdoor closed cycle trail.

A sports infield capable of accommodating 12 badminton courts and hospitality facilities are also proposed, while

the new arena will have a capacity of 5,000 for cultural events, such as concerts.

The complex is to be built on the site of the existing park and ride facility, which will lead to 600 new spaces being created between the new arena and the football stadium.

Mace project director David Grose said: "We have designed an iconic building which will

compliment Pride Park Stadium, but will also function as a stand-alone facility.

"The sculptured form will be very striking, exhibiting fluidity and movement to reflect the activities taking place inside."

DCC director of leisure and culture Claire Davenport added: "The arena will provide the city with modern facilities to be proud of."

Glasgow swimming centre work reaches landmark

Work on the £13.7m Tollcross International Swimming Centre has reached a landmark stage with the installation of a truss.

The truss forms the framework of an extension for the new six-lane 50m warm-up pool at Tollcross, which will add to an existing

10-lane 50 metre competition pool, providing a dedicated venue for swimming events at the Glasgow 2014 Commonwealth Games.

The design was carried out by Glasgow City Council's in-house design team. Construction work is being delivered by Barr Holdings.

New multi-sports facility opens in Bexley

The new multi-sport Europa Centre, which is to be used as a London 2012 Games Time Training Venue, has opened in Bexley, south east London.

Olympic and Paralympic volleyball teams will use the new 3,460sq m (37,243sq ft) facility, which was designed by Formation Architects and Whitecode Design.

ISG Construction and Stace were also involved with the scheme, which also provides a new home for Europa Gym Club, Europa Weightlifting

Club and Nemesis Boxing Club

Facilities include a gymnastic hall; a weightlifting and fitness studio; and physiotherapy and treatment rooms, as well as a mezzanine floor with multi-use space for functions, dance and martial arts, as well as a boxing studio.

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£9m Horley Leisure Centre opens

Reigate and Banstead Borough Council's (RBBC) new £9m Horley Leisure Centre has opened on the site of the former Court Lodge School.

S&P Architects designed the new complex, which has replaced the former Horley Anderson Centre and boasts a 25m, six-lane swimming pool and a training pool.

Built by Netherlands-based Pellikaan Construction, the centre also features a 45-station gym with free weights area; a four-court sports hall; and an exercise studio.

The facility offers separate male, female, family, group and disabled changing areas, while a cycle and car park is to be shared with the neighbouring Horley Town Football Club.

Greenwich Leisure Limited will operate Horley Leisure Centre on behalf of the council, which incorporates a number of eco-friendly

measure such as a biomass heating system and aims to be accessible to all users.

RBBC executive member for healthy communities Adam De Save said: "The centre looks amazing and provides fantastic new facilities to help people of all ages and abilities keep healthy and active."

Gloucestershire CCC ground plans rejected

Plans drawn up by Gloucestershire County Cricket Club (GCCC) and Linden Homes for a revamp of the County Ground have been rejected by Bristol City Council.

The decision has been described as a "massive disappointment" by GCCC chief executive Tom Richardson and means that international cricket matches will no longer take place at the venue.

Richardson also said the council's failure to approve the development proposals had placed the club's future in Bristol in doubt, hinting at a possible move to Gloucester.

£8.3m Pwllheli sailing centre plans put on show

Members of the public have been given the opportunity to comment on initial plans for the development of a new £8.3m National Sailing and Academy Centre, which will be located in Pwllheli, North Wales.

Gwynedd Council held a consultation day on 17 January to display the plans, which have been drawn up by Ellis Williams Architects and Dobson:Owen Architects.

Construction work is due to commence later this year, with the new facility scheduled to open its doors in 2013. It is hoped the scheme will enable Pwllheli to attract larger and more frequent sailing events.

£30m for national sports medicine centre

Health secretary Andrew Lansley has announced £30m of funding towards a new National Sports and Exercise Medicine Centre of Excellence across three UK locations.

Loughborough, Sheffield and London are the planned sites of three hubs that comprise the new facility, which is one of the government's main legacy commitments from the 2012 Games this summer.

The Centre of Excellence will help more people become active and treat injuries caused

by exercise and conditions that are associated with a lack of physical activity.

It is hoped the facility will help people suffering from existing conditions such as diabetes benefit from exercise, while returning injured people to physical health and work quickly.



Lansley said: "The Olympics are a once in a life-time opportunity for Britain and it provides a great opportunity for the NHS too.

"It will share research findings and best practice with the entire NHS so the whole country benefits." Details: http://lei.sr?a=B8e9A

Manchester in line for £18m leisure facilities investment

Three swimming pools in Manchester that offer "poor value for money" could be replaced with new facilities as part an £18m investment strategy announced by the local authority.

Manchester City Council's communities and neighbourhoods overview and scrutiny

committee backed the proposals before they went before the executive on 18 January.

A report discussed by the council said there is a "compelling case" to replace three outdated buildings at Levenshulme, Miles Platting and Chorlton, which are expensive to run.

Liverpool FC to opt for original stadium plans

Initial plans for a new Liverpool Football Club (LFC) stadium at Stanley Park, which were drawn up nine years ago, are to be pursued by US-based owner John Henry. The decision is likely to see alternative

plans drawn up by previous owners Tom Hicks and George Gillett ditched and will revive the original plans, drawn up by architects AFL in 2002.

LFC already has planning permission for the AFL plans, which would see the creation of a 60,000-seater "New Anfield" stadium at Grade II-listed Stanley Park.

Survey reveals cost of 'poor' phone response

A survey by Leisure-net Solutions has found that fitness operators could be losing out on potential members by failing to handle telephone enquiries properly.

The National call-Focus Survey tests membership enquiries against sector standards and this year's results saw the national average score decline by 8 per cent.

It is the worst score in the survey's fiveyear history and Leisure-net's Mike Hill said that it was "reasonable to assume" through the results that telephone responses had got worse. Details: http://lei.sr?a=B2c1j

"So far all clubs have been company-owned but we are looking to open our first franchised

club later this year," Singh told Health Club Management. "In fact we've very recently recruited our first franchisee so we're actively looking for a site for him to operate."

Singh added that he is currently looking to add seven further sites during 2012, bringing the number of truGyms locations to 11.

The contract covers four centres across the East Sussex district, with the non-profit trust

planning to invest a total of £7m in undertaking "major improvements" to facilities.

Spending plans include £1.8m on new equipment, which will help ensure each of the four leisure centres are able to compete with rival privately-operated sites.

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Roll-out for Shropshire chain

Independently-owned health club business Bodytech is to roll-out its affordable fitness concept throughout the UK by offering franchise opportunities to potential partners.

The new dual-use facilities are due to open in September and will be managed by 1610.



A recommended takeover bid for Asia-Pacific operator, the Living and Leisure Australia Group (LLA), has been submitted by Merlin Entertainments Group.

Merlin, one of the world's largest attractions operator, has made a bid that values LLA at around AU\$140m (£90m, EUR107m, US\$139m) on an equity value basis.

LLA directors have backed the offer, which will continue the expansion of Merlin's existing Asia-Pacific operations subject to the approval of LLA security holders.

Nine destinations are owned and operated by LLA through three divisions, which feature the Oceanis Group aquariums and the Australia Alpine Enterprises ski fields.

The Australia Treetop Adventures attractions are also part of LLA's portfolio, with the

deal set to follow Merlin's acquisition of Sydney Attractions Group earlier in 2011.

Merlin CEO Nick Varney said: "The acquisition would open up new markets to us and facilitate the continuing roll out of the Sea Life, Madame Tussauds, Eye and Legoland brands in the Asia Pacific region."

Milestone for Cheltenham museum project

A £6.3m redevelopment of Cheltenham Art Gallery and Museum has moved forward with the completion of ground and foundation works for its new town centre building.

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

Hotels 'losing billions' to fraud

New research from PKF and the University of Portsmouth has found that fraud could be costing the hotel industry in excess of £2bn each year.

Findings from The Resilience to Fraud of the UK Hotel Sector were combined with results of a separate study - both of which were undertaken by the two institutions.

The Resilience to Fraud of the UK Hotel Sector examined how the UK's hotel industry is currently protecting itself against fraudulent activity and identified areas which required more action.

Using a 50-point scale, the sector was found to be less resilient than other industries. It had an average score of 25.4 points, compared with 30.6 points for the private sector as a whole.

However, the sector did perform strongly in some areas - 88 per cent of respondents have a

zero-tolerance approach to fraud, while 85 per cent promptly reported suspected activity.

PKF's Stuart Collins said: "Given the challenging business environment, with the possibility of a double dip recession, hoteliers are advised to strengthen their protection against fraud." Details: http://lei.sr?a=k6poW

'Record year' for Small Luxury Hotels of the World

Small Luxury Hotels of the World (SLH) has reported record results for the year ending 31 December 2011, with reservations revenue up by nearly a quarter compared with 2010.

The business, which now has a portfolio of 523 hotels across more than 70 countries, saw

a 71 per cent increase in bookings through its slh.com website for the 12-month period.

Online bookings now account for 20 per cent of SLH's business, while membership of its loyalty programme - The Club - grew by 144 per cent to 140,000 members in 2011.

Malmaison; De Vere reveal appointments

Former chief executive of De Vere Village, Gary Davis, has been named as the new CEO of Malmaison and Hotel du Vin, with predecessor Robert Barclay Cook moving in the opposite direction.

Davis has left the De Vere Group after more than four years heading the Village Hotels arm, where he oversaw the brand's expansion and a 55 per cent growth in sales.

"It is a privilege to take over [Robert's] mantle, cast a fresh eye over the brands and take the business on to the next stage of its development," said Davis.

Meanwhile, former Malmaison and Hotel du Vin chief executive Robert Barclay Cook has succeeded Davis at the helm of De Vere

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Wales to have single environment agency

Plans to bring the Countryside Council for Wales; Environment Agency Wales; and Forestry Commission Wales together into one single environment organisation for Wales have been approved.

Welsh environment minister John Griffiths agreed to the plans following nine months of scoping work undertaken by representatives of the three organisations.

It is thought the move will result in savings of up to £158m over 10-years, with a consultation into the role and functions of the new body to be undertaken.

May launch for new Wales Coast Path

A path providing a continuous 870-mile (1,400km) route around the entire coast of Wales, from Chepstow in the south to Chester in the north, is to open in May.

The Welsh Assembly Government has led the scheme through the Coastal Access Improvement Programme, while European Union funding has also been provided.

It is expected that the Wales Coast Path will establish itself a "significant" asset for the Welsh tourism industry, while also leading to the creation of circular routes heading inland to towns and villages.

Park planned for Twickenham pool site

A new riverside park and public space will be created on the site of a former swimming pool in Twickenham, London, under plans revealed by Richmond Council.

The Jubilee Gardens project will include a grassed area behind Café Sunshine and parkland in front of the old diving board, which is to be retained to mark long-running efforts to reopen the facility.

Meanwhile, a section close to the old changing rooms is to be paved to create a public square. The council's plans have been shaped by local people and businesses.

Two options for Sussex scheme

Eastbourne Borough Council's (EBC) cabinet has agreed to draw up detailed business cases for two of the potential redevelopment options for the town's Devonshire Park.

A number of designs for the scheme were drawn up by London-based Marks Barfield Architects and the local authority has said it will now explore Options Two and Four in further detail.

Proposals being considered by EBC incorporate improved facilities for the international tennis tournament, which

could also see the possible relocation of centre court within the park.

New cafés, restaurants and visitors spaces; an exhibition/conference venue; improvements to the Congress Theatre and Winter Gardens; and upgraded seafront links are also mooted. It is anticipated that the capital cost of the

schemes will range between £30m and £43m, with the fourth option currently deemed to be the most expensive.

£1.15m boost for Belfast Hills LP plans

Nearly 30 individual projects that form part of the Belfast Hills Landscape Partnership (LP) scheme will benefit from £1.15m from the Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF).

In 2010, the partnership's proposals were awarded initial support and have now secured a full grant from the funding agency, following 12 months of detailed planning.

The Belfast Hills LP scheme comprises more than 5,000 hectares (12,355 acres) of hills that surround Belfast, Lisburn, Newtonabbey and

Antrim, including a number of public sites.

A total of 29 projects involving the conservation and restoration of built and natural heritage features are proposed, along with new and upgraded access routes.

Belfast Hills development manager Dr Lizzy Pinkerton said: "The LP scheme will be the impetus for an ongoing process of growth and development that will result in a sustainable legacy for our landscape and its people."

Lake District announces new management plan

A consortium of partner organisations and local councils have published a "radical" management plan for the Lake District National Park, which covers the next two decades.

The Lake District National Park Partnership comprises more than 20 agencies and is one

of the first organisations of its kind that have come together as part of a joint approach.

Among the main areas of focus for the new plan is sustainable tourism and visitor facilities, as well as farming and forestry; transport and movement; and employment and business.

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Theatre Royal Plymouth revamp plans submitted

Plymouth's Theatre Royal is to benefit from an extensive programme of work to modernise and upgrade facilities after plans were submitted to the local authority.

Andrzej Blonski Architects are behind the proposals, which include five main elements and include the creation of a new learning space in the existing basement.

Theatre Royal chief executive Adrian Vinken said: "Our aim is to modernise and make major improvements to the theatre to ensure it remains Plymouth's cultural centre of excellence for the next 50 years."

New 'boat hotel' opens on London's South Bank

A one-bedroom, maritime-themed 'hotel' installation - part of the London 2012 Festival - has opened at the Southbank Centre's Queen Elizabeth Hall in London.

Located on the roof of the South Bank venue, A Room for London has been designed by David Kohn Architects in coniunction with artist Fiona Banner following an international design contest.

The winning boat-shape design offers panoramic views of the River Thames from Big Ben to St Paul's Cathedral, and boasts a bedroom, a kitchenette and a library.

£1.2m for new creative opportunities in Scotland

Creative Scotland is to invest more than £1.2m to help people enjoy or take part in creative activities through a range of new First in a Lifetime opportunities.

A total of 10 projects stretching from the Shetland Islands to Dumfries are in line to receive financial support as part of a strategy to provide "unique inspirational experiences" across the country.

Creative Scotland chief executive Andrew Dixon said: "The programme will offer many more people the opportunity to see, explore and enjoy a rich cultural life."

Chichester venue plans backed

Chichester Festival Theatre (CFT) has been given the green light for a £22m redevelopment after local councillors approved planning consent and funding support.

The venue is to demolish all extensions added to the Grade II-listed building after 1962 and revamp the original hexagonal auditorium; as well as adding new foyer-side extensions. A back-of-house extension and a new outdoor piazza are also included in plans approved by Chichester District Council's (CDC) area



Meanwhile, CDC also pledged to support CFT in its bid to secure funding for the plans, with an investment of £500,000 to complement £1.5m from West Sussex County Council.

The local authority capital funding from both the district and county councils will also

help support the theatre's application for support from Arts Council England.

CDC deputy leader Myles Cullen said: "Not only will this directly and indirectly support around 350 local full-time equivalent jobs, but it will help to maintain the theatre's position as a leading international venue."

Council to review Felixstowe theatre's future

Suffolk Coastal District Council (SCDC) will review the future of Felixstowe's Spa Theatre, having revealed in December that it can no longer afford to subsidise the venue.

The cabinet has been asked to look again at its decision to invite proposals from local

groups or leisure operators following a meeting of the council's scrutiny committee.

Members of the cabinet will now discuss the theatre's future on 7 February, which currently receives £250,000 a year and requires at least £3m to be spent on upgrading its facilities.

RSC to launch 'major' touring partnership

The Royal Shakespeare Company (RSC) is to launch a major new touring and education partnership involving five leading regional theatres from April until 2015.

Hall for Cornwall; Hull Truck Theatre Company: Newcastle Theatre Royal: Southampton's Nuffield Theatre; and York Theatre Royal will partner with the RSC from April this year.

The RSC said the partnerships will expand its Learning and Performance Network, which is already reaching nearly 400 schools. Partner

venues will use the 'hub school and cluster' approach to run initiatives in Cornwall; Kingston-upon Hull; Middlesbrough; Southampton; and York respectively.

RSC artistic director Michael Boyd said: "We will be able to take the RSC right into the heart of communities who wouldn't ordinarily have easy access to our work."

ONS reports inbound growth

The Office of National Statistics (ONS) has reported that the total number of visitors by overseas residents to the UK grew by 2 per cent in the year to November 2011.

Visitor numbers from other parts of the world and North America increased by 10 per cent and 6 per cent respectively, although European visitor numbers remained broadly flat. However, there was a 1 per cent drop in the estimated overseas visitor numbers for the three months ending November 2011, com-

pared with figures for the previous quarter.

Meanwhile, statistics have shown an 8 per cent increase in visitor numbers to Scotland in the first nine months of the year, while expenditure for the period was up 11 per cent.

The domestic market generated a 10 per cent increase for the Scottish market, although



there was a 4 per cent decline in the number of overseas visitors despite an 18 per cent increase from North America.

Scottish tourism minister Fergus Ewing said: "These figures are an excellent demonstration of the resilience of Scotland's tourism industry." Details: http://lei.sr?a=v6Boz

Sir David said of his latest appointment: "The government has rightly identified tourism as one of the few industries that can quickly provide much

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needed growth and employment. "Our task will be to ensure that this acknowledgement is translated into policies

that make the UK a more competitive tourism destination."

Time for the tourism sector to deliver



KURT JANSON is policy director of Tourism Alliance

ne of the main areas in which the Tourism Alliance has been campaigning for the last 5 years is for the government to increase funding for the national tourism boards - VisitBritain and VisitEngland.

While most other Government agencies benefitted from increased public funding under the previous government (DCMS funding as a whole increased by more than 65 per cent between 2000 and 2007), there was no increase in the tourism budget.

With the economic downturn, the budget for VisitBritain and VisitEngland was cut by more than 30 per cent, meaning that since 2000 the government funding fell by more than 60 per cent in real terms. However, in the last few months there has been a significant reversal in approach.

First, VisitEngland has received £3m of unspent Olympic funding in order to boost domestic tourism and maximise the Olympic legacy. VisitBritain was then handed £27m of the £39m to be invested in the GREAT campaign, which will be used to attract 4.6 million more visitors from UK's most important existing markets and emerging ones, such as China and India.

In addition to these direct allocations, a further £19.8m has been allocated through VisitEngland for regional tourism development as part of the Regional Growth Fund bidding process, making the total investment in tourism over the last three months just under £50m. While this is extremely welcome, they are only one-off allocations rather than additions to annual grants.

This means the government will only consider further grants if VisitBritain and VisitEngland campaigns are shown to be successful. And to be successful, the industry needs to engage with the campaigns, which both rely on the private sector for funding, product offers and promotion if they are to achieve the targets set in terms of revenue growth and employment.

This is the challenge to the industry. If it wants the government to allocate funding to the national tourism boards in future, it must help make the VisitBritain and VisitEngland campaigns a success now.

Stevenage town centre is to undergo a makeover

Green light for £250m Stevenage regeneration

A major £250m mixed-use regeneration of Stevenage town centre in Hertfordshire, which is to include a number of leisure facilities, has been given the green light.

Stevenage Borough Council's planning and development committee has resolved to grant planning permission for the scheme, subject to legal agreements.

Restaurants and public spaces are included among the proposals, although the council said the timetable for delivering the project is "unclear" due to ongoing economic uncertainty.

Bromley South Central proposals submitted

London-based developer, The Cathedral Group, has submitted plans for a multi-million pound regeneration scheme, which will transform part of Bromley town centre.

The £80m Bromley South Central project will act as a catalyst for further regeneration at the southern end of the town and create a new residential and leisure quarter.

Facilities such as a nine-screen multiplex cinema and 25,000sq ft (2,323sq m) of cafés and restaurants feature among the proposals, along with a 130-bedroom business hotel and 200 apartments.

New vision unveiled for central Southampton

Southampton city centre is to undergo a radical transformation over the next 25 years under a new vision drawn up by David Lock Associates and unveiled by the local authority.

Proposals include a new Station Quarter and a revitalised Fruit and Vegetable Market area, as well as a new business district and a "world-class waterfront".

Southampton City Council's vision also highlights the city's £175m Cultural Quarter plans, which are centred around the newlyrepaved Guildhall Square.

Green light for £600m Canning Town plans

Bouygues Development and One Housing Group have been given the green light for a £600m regeneration project in Canning Town, London.

It forms part of the wider £3.7bn Canning Town and Custom House Regeneration Programme led by Newham Council, which is scheduled for completion by 2023.

The group anticipates that work will now start during the last quarter of 2012 following approval from the London Thames Gateway Development Corporation's planning committee.

The 6-hectare (14.8-acre) development is to boast more than 30,000sq m (322,917sq ft) of leisure and retail space and more than 5,000sq m (53,820sq ft) of community facilities.



Newham mayor Sir Robin Wales said: "This scheme is the real game-changer for Canning Town, and illustrates the scale of our ambition when it comes to delivering regeneration."

£659m 'Airport City' for Manchester

Chancellor George Osborne has announced plans for the establishment of the UK's first 'Airport City', a £659m mixeduse development to be located at Manchester Airport.

Manchester Airports Group is behind the proposals for the scheme, which comes after the government confirmed the area as a new Enterprise Zone in March 2011.

The 150-acre (60.7-hectare) development is centred on Manchester Airport's international links and will feature 2,500 hotel beds and 100,000

sq ft (9,290sq m) of retail and leisure.

A two-stage masterplan will see two core Airport City zones developed, the first adjacent to the airport's railway station and including hotel, office and retail uses among others.

The second zone will be located next to the existing cargo centre and will focus on logistics



and freight. The development is expected to be undertaken over a 12- to 15-year period.

A Central Park stretching more than 800m (2,625ft) will act as the centrepiece to the development and incorporate pavilions and event space, while linking with existing local green spaces. Details: http://lei.sr?a=j3z9k

Leisure facilities part of Uxbridge RAF base scheme

A 1,200-seat theatre and a 90-bedroom hotel are to be created as part of a major mixed-use redevelopment of a former Royal Air Force (RAF) base at Uxbridge, London.

The scheme will transform the base, which was the headquarters of No 11 Group RAF and was on the front line during the Battle of Britain during the Second World War.

Plans also feature the preservation of the Grade II-listed Hillingdon House and the Battle of Britain bunker, while a new 14-hectare (34.6-acre) district park is also proposed.

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

New corporate insolvency data from PricewaterhouseCoopers (PwC) has shown a growth in the number of hospitality and leisure sector businesses failing over the last 12 months.

The number of insolvencies for the fourth quarter of 2011 was up by 30 per cent compared with Q4 2010. PwC said a total of 375 firms across the sector collapsed in O4 2011.

David Chubb, business recovery partner and hospitality and leisure specialist at PwC, said Q4 data was a concern given the usual positive impact of Christmas period.

"It is worrying that both these sectors saw a marked increase in insolvencies," he said.

"We would expect to see more casualties in the post-Christmas period and we will have to

Goals postpones openings in 2012

Goals Soccer Centres has announced it has postponed the opening of additional five-aside football facilities in 2012 after switching its focus to "strong cash generation".

The East Kilbride-based group said that its first modular build venue in Chester - due to open in March - will be the only launch this year, with the postponement also allowing for full evaluation of the concept.

It follows the announcement that Goals had seen trading for the year to 31 December 2011 fall into line with market expectations, as overall sales increased by 9 per cent to £30.3m.

Like-for-like sales grew 1 per cent over the 12-month period, although a dispute over VAT on block bookings by teams saw overall likefor-like sales decrease by 2 per cent.

A Goals spokesperson said: "While 2011 was one of the most challenging years the

consumer has faced, it looks likely that 2012 will continue in much the same vein.
